What this did lead me to think about was to remind groups that there are new guidelines issued or changed from time to time and an updated version can be downloaded and printed from the GSO York website. I personally print a copy every year for the Monaco groups I attend.

Apologies were received from Laura, (Treasurer), Peter (CER Representative), Helen (Valbonne) and Bela (St. Tropez) who were unable to attend. Gabriela advised that she would no longer be attending IG in the role of GSR Monaco.

2. Approval of the Minutes of the Previous Meeting

The minutes of the meeting held in Nice on 30th November, 2013 were tabled, unanimously approved and adopted; a change was made to the Rotation of Chair which should read December 2014 and not September 2014.

Telephone Liaison Officer	- Requires access to a computer and accessible by telephone but person cannot frequently be out of the country; does not have to be a person residing in the Nice area. Present TLO has held this position since its inception, now time to rotate out
French Liaison Officer	- Regular attendee of French AA meetings, communicates events of French Meetings to English AA and vice-versa. Monika of Uzes will reflect on this and revert at the next IG meeting
Vice-Secretary	- Back up to Secretary
CER Representative	- Rotation out due Sept 2014
Alternate CER Officer	- Requires consistent attendance at IG as a serving member

Question: **Who could be nominated as Chair and could Vice-Chair not take over the position?

Reply: An internal nomination considered best as an outside person would have to read at least two (2) years of Minutes to get the understanding of how we work and would also have to shadow present Chair. As both Chair and Vice-Chair are a 3-year commitment, Vice-Chair would have to make a 6-year commitment if s/he were prepared to take on Chair. It was also pointed out that the Steering Committee could in fact nominate someone to take on the position. Equally pointed out that the person concerned could refuse the position!

Although there are guidelines to cover any position, could not each person (from GSR to Chair) write out their own "Job Description" so that any person following would have a very clear idea as to what each position entails. We were reminded that we are not an Intergroup like other Intergroups as we cover an extremely large area and we really function more like a General Service Office

GSR's were strongly encouraged to make known these available positions to their Groups

B. REPORTS

1. Public Information – PI Committee (pi@aa-riviera.org)

The PI Chairperson gave a brief rundown (hereunder) on what has been happening in PI in the last quarter

- There have been no PI meetings since last IG, basically everything is in place and runs with little effort.
- We do however need NEW ideas to move on
- Jointly Montpellier and Uzes initiated some advertising and were unsure of payment details. It would appear that this advertising may not yet have been published and therefore not yet due. Dan from Montpellier to check this out and get back to PI before any settlement made. PI advised that people should not take out advertising themselves – not only we do have approved advertising wording but we also have a budget. Unpaid bills cause problems and we must always protect the good name of AA, that is of the utmost importance. There is a PI Manual so for anyone interested in advertising, please feel free to check this out.
- The new Iphone App may cover our area (the whole of Europe) but apparently not too well identified at the moment. AA-UK does not endorse it because it does go to an outside source.
- With new technology (Internet, Iphone....) we do not need to print so often. However, printing will **not** be discontinued. At the present, we print 1000 lists per print run and this one to two times a year depending on changes made and quantity distributed.

Telephone Helpline:

Telephone Helpline Calls report attached

- Our helpline has now been running for seven (7) years
- This is our quietest quarter of the year with 19 calls
- No doubt the Internet is more frequently used to find meetings
- We still have a number of French callers; they are often requesting English meetings and French newcomers are coming more and more often to our English speaking meetings

- Stock is well up to date; can order at any time because we do have a quarterly budget
- Spent €425.40 for literature and another €339 which covers Chips (total €764.40)
- Overran budget by €139
- There is a laminated Service Structure chart now available for use in the rooms; we have a few copies but more could be ordered if Groups are interested; **please ask Literature Committee**; alternatively this Chart can be found in the AA Service Manual for Great Britain on about page 3 (see it here:

- And new pocket cards covering guidelines on the use of Internet social media have now been issued – again please **feel free to order these** for your Members who use social media

3. French/English Liaison Report (No report available at this time)

4. CER Report As our CER Rep was unable to attend our meeting we do not have his report at the moment. Questions / Answers to the Conference have been forwarded to him by email. It is to be noted that CER has voted to hold two Webex and two face to face meetings per year. This will alleviate the travelling costs.

CER Representative will be sending their reports in due course and these will be forwarded to you.

Possibility of hosting in our area for December 2014. After discussion it was agreed that we would just have to say NO this is not a concrete possibility. Our area of Europe is one of the most expensive to find accommodation and to date no one has come up with a reasonable accommodation and boardroom or convention centre costs. Added to that are the travelling expenses/time of all the CER Group. Considering the already too high costs for CER travels, we feel that it is unreasonable to spend further on this project.

5. Intergroup Accounts and Treasury Report

Attached for perusal are the Treasury Reports post-IG and the Treasurer's Notes.

- As of 05 March 2014 and after group contributions, we have **€4425** in the bank plus our prudent reserve. We have approximately **€2670** upcoming expenditure thus leaving an expected cash surplus of about **€1755**

A motion to send €1000 contribution (7th Tradition) to CER was tabled and accepted by the majority. To be noted: 2 members voted for a contribution of €1500

The Host Nation Liaison budget was questioned – what is it? Initially this was a budget for us to offer French Big Books (to our host nation) to Hospitals, Prisons, etc., which is not happening because we do not have a French Liaison Officer (FLO). It was brought up that if we were not using these funds for Big Books, perhaps we could use them for travelling expenses for an FLO if that person is travelling on our behalf (eg anywhere from Monaco to Montpellier return). Then we could get things moving and get people into the Prisons and Hospitals. We must not forget our primary purpose. To be discussed again at the next IG Meeting.

C. OLD BUSINESS

- **Conventions:**

Valbonne will be holding a one day mini-Convention with potluck lunch on **3rd May**. Anyone with ideas regarding format, topic or speakers is asked to contact the IG Secretary at: secretary@aa-riviera.org. More information will be sent out after their upcoming prep meeting.

Montpellier: Ann from Montpellier advised that the French AA will be holding their National Congress on 14-15-16 November and they have offered us a day of English speaking meetings within their Congress weekend. She advises that for **Saturday, 15th November** IG South of France has been invited to organise a day of four (4) English speaking meetings. The general topic of the Congress is GRATITUDE and we must remain in that theme. Ann is the liaison person between the French Congress and the English speaking AA. She is to return to their next prep meeting at the end of April with a report and Mike who has great experience in organising such an event will liaise directly with Ann in this regard.

This Convention news was greeted with great enthusiasm; a series of Steps over the four (4) meetings was suggested as our GRATITUDE topic. To be followed up.

D. ANY OTHER BUSINESS

1. Events Mailing List : Recently it has been noted that when (for example) the literature requests go out (through Events) people from all over the world reply. In the same way, do we want our Minutes being advised to the whole world? Or just to local people?

Questions: Do we have an Events Mailing List for local people only? Can we have a clean-up of the mailing list? Can people *unsubscribe*? Is it possible to have one list for local people? One list for PI Convention? One International?

Reply: Mike to check with Events and Guidelines and report back.

DISCUSSION: These are Service positions which require filling for the good of AA; GSR's and Members alike are asked to return to their Groups and ask **WHY** individuals (Group Members) are not willing to come forward and **HELP**. We need new blood, in every area, we need help. The current Officers have, for the most part, been around for a long time and they are tired. We asked ourselves why people are not coming to IG? Why are they leaving it to others to do the service which is necessary for the functioning of the groups? Do people know what happens at IG? Do they care? It was suggested that some people had bad feelings around IG from the past – that they believe it is a place of argument and intolerance and do not come to see for themselves. Or is there a general apathy? This will be discussed again at the next IG Meeting (in September).

In the meantime, GSR's and Members are asked to discuss this with Groups remembering that InterGroup was set up by the Groups and for the Groups to help each Group by (for example):

- Negotiating and paying for our Insurance (without which a Group cannot legally hold a Meeting)
- Preparing, keeping up-to-date and printing out Meeting Lists / Website (without which no one knows where an AA Group can be found)
- Constructed, maintains and continually runs a HelpLine to be there for the alcoholic who still suffers (getting 12 steppers out to that alcoholic who has called in)
- Ordering, bringing into this country, stocking and distributing our Literature and our Chips as per individual Group's needs
- Being the connection between each Group to help out each other where and when required

We are reminded that Gratitude is an action, not a feeling. Giving back is not just money (7th Tradition) but is also Service. What do Groups want, what do Groups need, do Groups realise what IG does for them/us? Do Groups want InterGroup to continue.

Please bring your Group's responses back to the next IG Meeting and/or advise Secretary by email, thank you.

B. REPORTS

1. Public Information – PI Committee (pi@aa-riviera.org)

The PI Chairperson gave a brief report advising that not much has been happening since the last IG Meeting. He reiterated that if new people came into the Committee it would be a good way to generate new ideas regarding what more we could be doing to reach that alcoholic who still suffers.

- The structures previously set up all work well and more or less work automatically
- We still have Big Books available for passing out to Libraries (for example). Here again, bring your ideas of where best to place these to reach the still suffering alcoholic

Telephone Helpline:

Telephone Summary Classification of Calls report attached (TLO can be called anytime for assistance)

- Number of calls are up this quarter
- TLO is aware that at least 3 newcomers were taken into hand by 12 steppers

H&I Although no report this quarter, those people who do the hospital rounds will be invited to the next IG meeting

2. Literature Report

- The Valbonne mini-Convention was supplied with literature and we made 70Euros in sales
- Pamphlets were handed on to Groups as well as Chips
- We do not have blank chips but do have 24hour as well as 1-2-3-6 month chips and on up to 50years. Most of the Chip orders are for top ups to Group's stock and we continue to practice recycling of our old chips; Chips cost about 3Euros/each so please bear that in mind when bringing sale profits to IG for your Groups
- Groups are provided the literature that they use in Meetings free of cost. They also are provided with Literature to sell however are reminded that we need to know (and be reimbursed) for any literature/chips sold/amount
- Please remember that newcomers are not aware of the Literature and/or Chip policies made by IG in the past. It would be a good idea if GSRs reminded Group Members generally of this and to let newcomers know of these policies (above).

3. French/English Liaison Report (No report available at this time as we have no Liaison Officer)

It was pointed out that the Monaco Group did purchase their own French BigBooks independently to cover their own needs. If anyone requires French BigBooks our Literature Committee will advise the purchase point for these.

4. CER Report

Our CER Rep., Peter, was unable to attend the last on-line meeting. Now both he and the IG Secretary (who does the mailings) have been issued with the relevant documents covering this, so all GSRs were provided with CER reports. He noted that :

- Here as well there is a lack of general enthusiasm although the past and present Chairs were/are extremely enthusiastic. As for IG, any AA member can attend just cannot vote
- Perhaps CER's best points are the maintenance of the European website which keeps us all connected AND
- CER is the clearing house for questions to Conference and the corresponding feedback
- It is extremely expensive to have delegates travel and CER is now trying out 2 face to face and 2 on-line meetings annually (instead of 4 face to face) to reduce CER costs. To be reviewed.
- CER is trying to build up their prudent reserve which explains their lack of sending down any contribution to GSO in York
- A lot of time is spent on *just discussing things* as in any meeting and that is how we are reminded of points known by some but not by all. That is how we learn what might be going on with a Group or an Area which might not come to light without these discussions
- QUESTION: Did our statement concerning our impossibility to host a CER Meeting (we cover a very expensive travel/hotel area) get delivered to CER? Peter, will investigate and confirm at our next IG Meeting

5. Intergroup Accounts and Treasury Report

Attached for perusal are the Treasury Reports post-IG and the Treasurer's Notes.

- As of 24th May 2014 and after group present day contributions, we have **€5540** in the bank plus our prudent reserve. We have approximately **€4492** upcoming expenditure thus leaving a cash surplus of about **€1046**.

A motion to send no contribution (7th Tradition) to CER at this time was tabled and voted as acceptable. We will look at our finances at the end of June when expected Group contributions have been received and revise our financial situation at the September IG Meeting.

Question: Apparently it is possible for us to send a contribution directly to GSO NEW YORK for the Translation Department. Some interest was shown for this but more information was requested. Francis will check this out and we will look at this again at the September IG Meeting. We were nevertheless reminded that it is important to continue to financially support the structure to which we are and remain attached, i.e., Alcoholics Anonymous Great Britain, via CER.

D. OLD BUSINESS

- **Host Nation Liaison budget** - The 250Euro budget was initially for the FLO to travel and then thought to be useful to pay for BigBooks in French hospitals. Apparently not only are the French hospitals not interested in our BigBooks but that should be a PI question/budget question and not an FLO one anyway. It was reiterated that the English need the French to get into hospitals and that this Liaison is very important.
- **French Congress (November)** – Ann was unable to attend however her report was read out :
 - Their flyer has been put on the AA South of France website: There is a 5hour gap between English meetings at which time there will be Spanish meetings and the French Plenière (followed by the last English meeting). These times cannot be changed.
 - All information for the good of AA Southwest of France will go directly from Ann to them
 - All hard copies for AA Southwest of France will go directly to them from Ann and

MINUTES OF THE INTERGROUP MEETING
Held in St. Paul's Church, MONACO
On 06 September, 2014

A. OPENING:

The Chair opened the meeting at 13H30 with the serenity prayer and the reading of the TWELVE TRADITIONS and TWELVE CONCEPTS.

1. Introduction from those present and Group Roll Call

2. Approval of the Minutes of the Previous Meeting

The Minutes of the meeting held in Valbonne on 24th May 2014 were tabled and were unanimously approved and adopted (as per changes discussed). These can now be put on the Website.

PI Chair	Ideally this person needs PI experience, preferably from within the existing PI Committee as would need knowledge of the workings of PI, the AA Literature and structures already in place

Group Service Representatives (GSRs) are asked to inform their Groups about these available positions. As well, the Public Information (PI) Committee Spokesperson will put a list of the INTERGROUP (IG) officers, CER Representative and useful contacts on AA WEBSITE; this same list can be found at the end of the Minutes.

DISCUSSION:

- Potential Candidate for **French Liaison Officer**. The person concerned is unable to make that time commitment at the moment and will be confirming availability at the time of the next IG Meeting (29 Nov 2014);
- Interest has been shown for the **Alternate CER** position; duties, specifics were outlined. Sobriety required 2-3 years as per Guidelines p. 87/88. An incoming CER or Alternate could shadow outgoing Rep Peter and this will be further discussed at the next IG Meeting. The CER positions require a lot of reading and learning
- Dan of Montpellier put his name forward as **Vice-Chair** and he could be shadowed by the ex-Chairs present. Consequently, **motion** was made to accept DanW as Vice-Chair, seconded and **voted**.
- It was suggested that we have at Intergroup 3 ex Chairs who could stand in the Chair position if no one person is available for that position. One member suggested that this is not a good idea as weakens the Chair position. Its importance could be lost. Nevertheless an ex-Chair will stand in at next IG Meeting and not leave that up to the new Vice-Chair (DanW)

B. REPORTS

1. Public Information – PI Committee (pi@aa-riviera.org)

The PI Acting Secretary gave a brief report advising that a meeting of the Committee had recently taken place in Nice at which time there was the usual discussion of what is done in PI

- He reiterated that if new people came into the Committee it would be a good way to generate fresh ideas regarding what more we could be doing to reach that alcoholic who still suffers
- We have a list of about 50 English speaking Doctors/Dentists. They will be provided with literature as well as the new park bench poster listing the AA South of France Helpline Telephone Number
- New Meeting Lists are expected to go to print within the next two weeks so any changes to Meetings are required urgently
- The flyers covering the November **French Congress in Montpellier** had been received and passed out to the Groups. Monika advises that she is in charge of the Info to Professional Meeting scheduled at the Congress and invites any one of us to submit to her names of French Medical professionals who we think might be interested in attending. Secretary is to immediately send out an email to GSRs/Representatives to give out Monika's contact details in this regard and we are asked to contact her directly for further information we individuals may require
- PI were asked if they would be willing to travel and would Groups be getting these new posters: Affirmative
- aa-riviera.org is interchangeable with all three sites, .com .net .org They all belong to us and anyone typing in one or the other will get to our site

(a) Telephone Helpline:

Telephone Summary Classification of Calls report attached (TLO can be called anytime for assistance)

- We understand that more people are using the Internet to get their information
- The structures previously set up and the system work well
- The TLO wants to rotate out and will work with incoming candidate. The position is serious and the structure does need to be understood.

(b) H&I

Oversight of H&I continues to be carried out by Paul and Paolo who attend the Centre Hospitalier Princess Grace (CHPG) every 3 weeks (Mondays)

- Although an Anglo-Saxon group (alternating men and women), these Big Book meetings are in French
- They have been nicknamed the Service Après Vente and for some of the patients, our SAV is all they have. We give out information about AA, what it is about, we keep it even keeled and do not do drunkalogs.
- Anyone is welcome to come along and help

(c) Events (Mailing List)

- Number of people on the list changes as new subscriptions arrive and others unsubscribe. At the moment there are 138 people on this list.
- Events sends out information concerning such things as Birthday shares, Group changes, advice of AA South of France website posting of that such things as Minutes, Agendas, Insurance Certificates etc.– anything pertinent to our corner of the AA world
- GSRs and Reps are asked to periodically advise Group Members (in particular newcomers) to subscribe to this mailing list so that we can all receive news as it becomes available

2. Literature Report

- Literature-Chip orders were handed on to Groups
- Groups are provided the literature that they use in Meetings free of charge. They also are provided with Literature to sell however are reminded that we need to know (and be reimbursed) for any literature/chips sold/amount
- Please remember that newcomers are not aware of the Literature and/or Chip policies made by IG in the past. It would be a good idea if GSRs reminded Group Members generally of this and to let newcomers know of these policies (above).
- A full range of AA literature has been provided for the French Congress and 2 (two) sets of Chips
- Copies of the AA Structure Handbooks introduced in 2013 were handed out to Secretary (for Chair), PI, Treasurer and the GSR's who asked for them. These are relatively quite expensive and do not seem to be as practical as the Binder version. The binder version only needs to be downloaded/printed from the GB website once a year to be updated in the existing binders, and we do not know when updated hard copy handbooks will be printed; making a reference photocopy of pages in this book could quite easily break the spine within a short time. The Literature Committee is therefore hesitant about buying more copies of the new version Handbooks.

3. French/English Liaison Report (No report available at this time as we have no Liaison Officer)

4. **CER Report** (See attached Minutes from Representative)

Our CER Rep was unable to attend this meeting as the CER on-line Meeting was in attendance at the same time. **Post IG** His report covering the 6 September 2014 CER Meeting received is attached. The next CER Meeting is a face to face one, scheduled in Milan 6-7 December, 2014 and although rotating out, he has agreed to attend that Meeting. Following that, the next scheduled CER meeting is scheduled for 06/07 March, 2015 in Milan.

5. **Intergroup Accounts and Treasury Report**

Attached for perusal are the Treasury Reports post-IG and the Treasurer's Notes.

As of 18 Sept and after group present day contributions, we have €5512 in the bank plus our prudent reserve of €8579. We have approximately €4359 upcoming expenditure thus leaving an expected cash surplus of about €1153 at end November 2014.

*****Please note, (post IG Meeting):**

There was a discrepancy of 50 euros between what was recorded at Intergroup and how much we had at the final tally. Please could all Group treasurers who brought CASH (not cheques) to IG double-check their group accounts and confirm the amount of their group donations? Please send your confirmation to elementairewatson@gmail.com. Please excuse the inconvenience, and Thank you all for your help!

*Vice-Treasurer informed us that Treasurer (absent) felt we could send a contribution (7th Tradition) of €1500 to CER. There was a request from the floor that we up this to €2000; after discussion it was agreed that we would follow Treasurer's informed decision and **voted** a contribution of €1500 as acceptable..*

Question: -Why are we holding such a high amount in our Prudent Reserve, should those funds not be sent down to CER?

Answer : -This represents about half a year of our budgeted expenses. We have upcoming expenses due and must always honour our commitments. Should we fail to do so, the Executive of the Association 1901 is legally financially responsible for honouring those commitments. It took a long time to build up this prudent reserve and IG has previously voted that it considered that it is necessary to maintain this level. Attendees understood and accepted answer.

Gratitude Week (June 10th week) Contributions from Groups total €260.63. Treasurer will be sending this on to York by mid-September 2014. **Motion** put up that IG pays for the transfer charges, **voted** acceptable.

C. OLD BUSINESS

1. Possibility of sending a contribution directly to GSO NEW YORK for the Translation Department: Despite several contacts, no replies from New York USA have been received. Treasurer advises that there is a similar set up in GSO YORK UK and she will look into this for us. The results of her endeavours will be advised at the next IG Meeting (November 29, 2014)

2. Statements via Events :

Events Officer uses his own logic / knowledge when sending messages out via the mailing list. If in any doubt, he consults with the Steering Committee. Events asked that this be confirmed, i.e., can Events Officer make (logical) decisions as to what messages can send of his own accord for the good of AA (e.g., advising that the Agendas are up on the website). **Motion** carried, **voted** affirmative

3. DISCUSSION concerning lack of participation of Members generally at IG:

- Some people are not in their best element to help at IG level, their effectiveness might lie best working one on one with a suffering alcoholic, or they might best be serving a Service position at Group level
- Sponsors could direct their sponsees into Service work (especially after a year of sobriety).
- Could people not be persuaded to come to IG Meetings a couple of times just to see what happens? Bring your own Group Members. If people walk through the door, they will likely get INTERESTED especially if they show up a couple of times.
- Have there been bad feelings in the past? Yes. Was their shouting in the past? Yes? Did this keep people away? Yes. And No. Has this behaviour changed? Yes
- We were reminded that IG is now 20 years old and we do have a strong mandate from (over 30) Groups to do what has to be done. And we are privileged to have this big area covered by our IG (which does not happen in other countries).

Question: An attendee asked “How does someone end up being a GSR even if they have not done service work within their Group? And how does someone end up being an officer within IG itself

Answer: By having enough sobriety to be willing to volunteer; followed by walking through the door, and then by attending/reporting back to Groups (only GSRs will have voting rights). Members at large can certainly go back to Groups and carry the IG news. That leads to becoming involved, learning what needs to be done, finding a position available for one’s effectiveness, volunteering follows and the ball starts rolling.

When positions become available in IG, an interested person can put his/herself forward for this and/or another Member can nominate him/her. The attending Members can either vote on the fulfilment of that position immediately or request that this thought be carried over to the next IG meeting to allow for an informed decision/vote. Previous Minutes, Newsletters, and AA Guidelines, are available to us to learn about such things as sobriety requirements, duty time, requirements of positions etc. We were also reminded that incoming people can be and will be shadowed, always remembering that this is a WE program and we do not have to do this alone.

It was mentioned that in AA USA 95% of the work is done by 5% of the people. Those 5% of the people have a sobriety rate of 100%!

Once all present had had a chance to express their or their group members’ views it was suggested that IG should once again hold its Group Conscience to see if there was any area where we could improve our actions. It was agreed at the suggestion of the Chair that this should take place; no actual date was set.

2. Approval of the Minutes of the Previous Meeting

The Minutes of the meeting held in Monaco on 6th September, 2014 were tabled and were unanimously approved and adopted. They can now be posted on our Website.

3. AVAILABLE POSITIONS**

- The Chair position does need to be filled. Ex Chairs are willing to sit in for the next 3 months following which we trust the position will be filled. Although this position (and others) have, in the past, usually been filled from Jan to Dec., we were reminded that we must remain flexible and accept that sometimes positions will be filled at other times of the year.

- Monika of Uzes was nominated and voted into the position of Host Nation Liaison Officer (HNLO). We agreed that the travelling costs to/from IG meetings would be covered by IG

B. NEW BUSINESS

AGM Report 2015 Budget

- We were advised that as Antonia had left the area, this change of Officers of the Association had to be legally notified to the Prefecture. This has been done; the Officers presently in position are Mike, Maria and Birgitta.
- Insurance was paid up last year and the corresponding Policy (Attestation) was put up on our Website. Insurance is not yet in for this year 2015 (usually comes about mid-December). The Policy for this year will be put up as soon as available and we will be advised of this at that time. This is needed by landlords of our Meeting Rooms so please feel free to download it and pass it on.
- Everything pertaining to us/Association is in order.
- In accordance with the Law in France covering an Association 1901, this AGM has reached a quorum. Accounts to 22nd November, 2014 were outlined by our Treasurer (see attached), discussed and these 2014 Accounts were approved. The proposed Budget for 2015 was advised.

C. REPORTS

1. Literature Report

- We provided literature for the AA French Congress English Literature stand plus 2 full sets of chips. There was a total of 286.10€ literature sold and the remaining literature sent will stay with the English meetings in Montpellier.
- For this quarter's IG Meeting, a massive order had been received by the Literature Committee from only 6 Groups. They are wondering whether some of these orders are to cover Meetings' literature or to be sold by Groups. The Committee is saying they need to get a feeling as to what is happening, i.e., why does a Group order so many books at one time (12 Living Sober and 10 Daily Reflections) which surely cannot all be sold to newcomers or members in any one quarter. It was explained by a member from Nice that there are several meetings who share the same literature and it appears to be disappearing; suggestion was that as this is not one's own literature, people may not care why Groups are ordering so much.
- We are encouraged to remind Group members that we are always open to recycling literature. Used copies are still good literature. If Group(s) have literature which they find they are not using, or change the topic of their meeting and no longer have use for the books put out for the old meeting, please bring them back to the Literature Committee. If they are in a good enough condition they can be redistributed to other meetings.
- It was pointed out that if a Group says that they are missing Literature/Chips, it is a good idea to go and check it out for yourself, sometimes cupboards shared means stock gets put elsewhere and missing literature could be found outside of its usual place (this will help avoid expenses).
- Literature Committee was asked if IG provided the plasticized Slogans (No). These could be ordered through the Literature Committee. We were also advised that we could go on to the USA AA site and download these in pdf form. Then each Group would be responsible for their own plasticizing.

- We have a fantastic system going here whereby IG finances Group's literature for their use in their meetings by using the 7th tradition passed down by the groups. Even groups who do not pass their 7th tradition on to IG are never refused literature thereby ensuring that they have literature which can be sold to the newcomer, or financed by other members in the group to give to the newcomer. This does not happen elsewhere. GSR's, please remind your Groups that all literature sales monies are to be returned to IG Treasurer.

2. Public Information – PI Committee (Report attached) (pi@aa-riviera.org)

The PI Chairperson gave a brief rundown (hereunder) on what has been happening in PI in the last quarter. He reminded us that new ideas and new members are always welcome.

- The new Meeting List has been printed and distributed – there are some 30 changes – Our computer whiz has left the country so we are looking for help from anyone able to navigate and use **Quark** (we might change to Adobe). Please put the word out, help is welcome
- **HTML** and **CSS** help is also required to update our tired website, help is welcome
- Website has brought in several enquires via email, a number of which concerned the English meetings to be held during the Montpellier Congress
- App: LWTF was raised: we have not heard recently but they were thinking of giving us their software
- The Riviera Radio (audio) ad needs refreshing and this will be done in the new year (2015). We have 36 ads of 6 speakers presently but they have been around for the past 3-4 years. Time to move on
- We advertise in all English publications (that we know of). Montpellier GSR was asked to talk with the Languedoc Sun concerning a further invoice – the PI Committee Chairperson would help him if needed
- New Posters have been received, our HelpLine number inserted on them, plasticized and ready to go out with the "Information to Doctors" package which project is well underway
- A list of universities and major corporations (using English speaking employees) is now being prepared and GSR's are again asked to approach their Groups for addresses/contact details so that we can get in touch with the HR departments
- ***Elizabeth's story is to be printed in the next Riviera Reporter so watch out for that article***
- The 2015 budget is the same as 2014 (5000€), we still hold 1600 € so net is 3400€.

Telephone Helpline:

Telephone Summary Classification of Calls report attached

- Quite a few newcomers have called
- A feeling that the Internet usage means that we are getting less telephone calls now
- Telephone Liaison Officer (TLO) is hoping to put into place a Responders' training session for the Montpellier and Aix Groups in the up-coming year (2015). Anyone else interested, please let her know so that she can schedule workshops accordingly. The Monaco area needs some responders. At the moment TLO has only 7 responders altogether as people have recently left the country.

H&I

- We are still visiting The Princess Grace Hospital in Monaco on a monthly basis, doing this on a male/male female/female basis if possible. If not that ratio, then we do what we can. There is a lot of enthusiasm from Monaco Groups
- Paolo wrote to the Police in Nice to introduce ourselves. They were sending someone from Menton to go to AA meetings but they wanted him to go to a French AA and not English AA.

3. French/English Liaison Report (Monica has *just* been voted in to HNLO; there is no Report at this time)

4. CER Report (Please note that the various reports sent out by CER Delegate are distributed to GSR's and/or Group Members at the same time as the Minutes, albeit under separate cover to avoid sending out too many documents in one message)

- The last meeting was on-line, was extremely efficient and held in just 4hours, the Steering Committee was well organized
- CER PI initiative proposed by their PI Committee was to attend the European Mental Health Conference in Tallin (Eastonia); this was closely looked at and a Workshop was to be organised at that Conference. Target audience was Mental Health Professionals specializing in substance abuse. It was not an AA event per se, it was PI, undertaken by Region.
- CER Group Inventory to be held in Milan in December – what needs to be addressed?
- From CER, Margareta and Peter did an on-line BB Workshop early November 2014, whereby 51 people logged in, it was a great experience and there was very good feedback
- This is a functioning region because people come from far flung areas – perhaps at the beginning, we were going over “stuff” but now we are really moving ahead; amazing people with new enthusiasm, quite young participation
- Per year there are now 2 face to face meetings and 2 on-line which reduces travel budget
- If CER meetings stay in Germany, it makes for easy travelling with good Youth Hostels. Travelling elsewhere, increases the travel costs. The majority of the meetings were originally held in Germany because many Groups and Intergroups were based on or around the Military bases there.
- CER Representative Peter will be attending his last meeting in Milan and advises that this is a great opportunity for anyone to join him to see what is going on, how to participate and to learn from his experience. He will of course be available to help if anyone wants to tag along so please contact him if you are interested. (He may be driving).

5. Intergroup Accounts and Treasury Report

Attached for perusal are the Treasury Reports and the Treasurer's Notes.

- As of 1 December, 2014 and after group contributions, we have **€ 6118.67** in the bank plus our prudent reserve. We have approximately **€ 4614** upcoming expenditure thus leaving a cash surplus of about **€ 1504** at the next IG.
