- Question: What about advertising via social media (eg Facebook) as certainly this is the way to attract the new generation's attention – our guidelines will be checked on this point
- A call out from PI for new blood participation brought out an immediate response from two attending Members who will be put on the RoundRobin email list and they plan to attend the next PI Meeting (to be announced) – NB Post IG Meeting – April 29<sup>th</sup> scheduled for the next one in Nice

#### **Telephone Helpline:**

Telephone Summary Classification of Calls report attached (TLO can be called anytime for assistance)

- Number of calls are running lower this quarter – 15 calls which is the smallest ever which reflects the changes of the way people are doing things; using the website as opposed to calling. These calls reflect: 1 Newcomer, 10 AA members and 4 French calls
- Everyone (responders) are still doing their shifts and everything for the helpline is in place

#### 5. Intergroup Accounts and Treasury Report

- We do not presently have a Vice-Treasurer which means that our Treasurer must go it alone. It was suggested and accepted that we take it upon ourselves to have one of our Members help by carrying out an internal audit.
- Jenny from Valbonne has put herself forward to shadow our Treasurer over the next three months with an aim to taking on the position of Vice-Treasurer
- We now require one more signing authority officer for our cheques and Nikki stepped up to this request. She will be communicating with the President of our Association in this regard
- We came into IG with a bank balance of **€ 1953.30**  
We received Group & IG donations € 2168.00  
thus giving us a balance of **€ 4121.30**  
With a planned spending for upcoming quarter € 1854.15  
Payments pending € 28.07  
it was voted to send a donation to Region CER of € 1500.00  
leaving a projected cash surplus to end May of: **€ 739.08**  
Our prudent reserve including interest, € 65.66, now stands at € 8820.92

2. Would the Fellowship discuss and share experience on the size of Intergroups both in terms of geography and number of constituent groups which would be effective.  Could the Fellowship provide guidance on how Intergroups too small or too large effect change?	Our IG is different as so large - we really are more on the lines of a Region

## INTERGROUP OFFICERS' POSITION REQUIREMENTS

**All positions have people available to walk the incoming person through the ropes, nothing has to be done alone. Basically there is a commitment to attend all Intergroup Meetings which are held four times a year and always on a Saturday.**

**Sponsors can guide their sponsees towards service position by inviting them to attend IG Meetings as an observer. Most positions require a one-year length of sobriety. Holding these service positions now ensure that our grandchildren have a place to go if and when it is their time to find Alcoholics Anonymous**

***\*\*Job Descriptions to be taken from AA Manual Guidelines; most rooms have a service manual containing the Guidelines. In addition, people can ask the person in that position, or their sponsor. Alternately these Guidelines can be found at: see addresses in "Useful Contacts" within these Minutes***

### LITERATURE

- Must have a car to transport literature orders to IG Meetings
- Be able to use a computer to send/receive emails and order literature
- Must be present for parcel delivery (YORK central offices now use a delivery service which no longer leaves parcels with the P.O. so that option is entirely out)
- Have room for stocking literature
- Be physically capable to lift boxes

### SECRETARY

- Be available to attend (all) IG Meetings
- Be able to use a computer to send/receive emails
- Take notes of Meetings
- Draw up Minutes of those Meetings. (Does not have to do anything alone, there are always people prepared to proofread Minutes etc).
- Schedule reminders of confirmed events (eg Gratitude Week)

### PUBLIC INFORMATION (PI) CHAIRPERSON

- Chairperson is not the most important position but should come from within the Committee to know what has been and is going on.
- Chairperson basically holds a secretarial role, i.e.,
  - takes notes and draws up Minutes of PI Meetings,
  - calls the Meetings and by a Round Robin method invites scheduling of Meetings, comments on projects, etc.
  - ensures that the Advertising in place is up-to-date
  - sees that books are sent to Prisons
  - oversees up-date and printing of Meeting Lists..
- S/he maintains the website,
- It is preferable that the Chairperson lives in Nice as the PI meetings should be held locally to have a maximum number of people attend.

## **TELEPHONE LIAISON OFFICER (TLO)**

- This position could be opened up to everyone and not necessarily just to IG participants.
- This rewarding position requires an in-country presence but not a lot of work. The system works automatically and is low maintenance.
- Access to a computer and being accessible by telephone are necessities,
- Needs to programme changes (eg., before/after holidays) on Orange website.
- Occasionally there might be a problem to resolve, either with the computer (not high technology) or a responder requiring verbal assistance or information.
- It is an advantage to speak French as there is a limited amount of contact with Orange (telephone operator) - however, this can be delegated to a French speaker.
- Occasional updating of various lists of contacts used by responders.
- Occasional update of responder's manual.
- Holding 'workshops' to train new responders (half an hour)
- Collecting information on calls from responders every quarter to prepare report for inter-group.
- Taking part in Public Information meetings as telephone service comes under the umbrella of PI.
- TLO will train the incoming person and be available to answer any questions

## **CONTINENTAL EUROPEAN REGION (CER) REPRESENTATIVE ALTERNATE**

- Requires consistent attendance at IG as a serving member.
- A rewarding position to carry the message. Will learn to understand Conference and know the immediate IG area. Works with very enthusiastic AA Service people within the Service Structure.

## **TREASURER**

- Handle cash flow
- Bank operations
- Draw up Treasury reports for Intergroup
- Present (Acting)Treasurer / incoming treasurer (and V.Treasurer) will go through a working period together (shadow each other)

## **Vice-TREASURER**

- Assists Treasurer when needed, attends IG (in particular when Treasurer is absent)

## **HOST NATION LIAISON OFFICER**

- Attends French AA meetings and passes on pertinent information to English AA (eg., up-coming French events whereby English AA may well be able to participate by having the use of room(s) for English speaking meetings.
